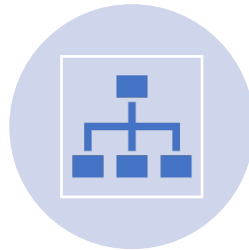

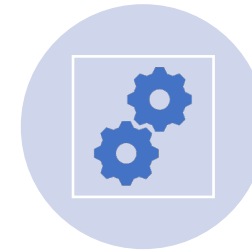

Either directly or through intermediaries, providing various dimensions of technology implementation and capacity-building, including:

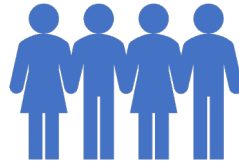
- IT-related assessments

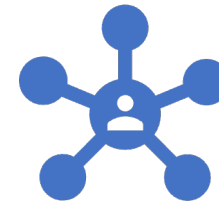

Inviting Existing Grantees to Apply for Tech Grants

Adding 10% for Tech

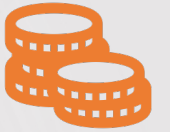
